- The application includes two main sections:
 - 250 word account of **WHY** you want to go to Malawi on this trip i.e. what is your motivation?
 - 250 words on what **you have to offer**, especially in assisting in literacy/numeracy/IT. Include any past relevant experience as well as any special skills or interests you have

Your application form

- To apply send me a file with the following details (which I will share with our organisers in Malawi, Fisherman's Rest) to p.lund@coventry.ac.uk:
- Recent photo of you
- Full name (Surname/first name) **as it appears on your passport**
- Date of birth (needed for insurance)
- Your course and level
- I also need to know if you have any medical condition.
- Then the two paragraphs:
- 250 words on your motivation in coming on this trip
- 250 words on what you have to offer
